Eligibility Requirements

Basis for acceptance will include a review by our Acceptance Review Committee.

This program is designed for students with a diagnosis of a developmental disability or on the Autism Spectrum, are between ages 17-22, able to independently perform self-help skills or have an attendant.

Students will be prioritized as follows:

- 1) Top priority will be given to students who have already been accepted into a college and will begin in the 2012-13 school year, or those already enrolled in college but need to increase their college skills.
- 2) Second priority will be given to high school juniors and seniors or others planning to attend college this school year.
